Classes #1, 18, 20 – Horse Trial

Dressage Test – Intro C,

Cross country – fences 18”-2’3”, consisting of straightforward, mainly brush piles and small logs (not timed)

Show jumping – 6-8 fences 2’-2’3”

Class #2 - Holiday themed freestyle

All levels are welcome and can ridden English or Western. Specify level on entry form. Music must be holiday themed. Entrants are judged based on USDF/FEI freestyle requirements at their chosen level for musical freestyles.

Class #3 – Holiday themed Pas de Deux/Quadrille

All levels are welcome and can be ridden English or Western. Specify level on entry form. Music must be holiday themed. Entrants are judged based on USDF Pas de Deux/Quadrille requirements which can be found at <http://www.usdf.org/docs/tests/dressage/pasdedeux.pdf>

Class #4,5,6 – Choose Your Own Dressage Test

All levels are welcome and can be ridden English or Western. Specify level on entry form.

Class #7-9 – Prix Caprilli

Prix Caprilli tests are a form of combined training in which a dressage test is ridden with several required jumps. The purpose of Prix Caprilli is to determine that the correct foundation is being laid for successful training of the riding horse: that the horse moves freely forward in a relaxed manner and with rhythm, both on the flat and over small fences, its spine always parallel to the track of the prescribed movement; that it accepts the bit and obeys simple aids of the rider. The height depends on the test. Test 1 will be small crossrails, Test 2 – will be 18 inches, test 3 will be 2'. Class #10-13 – Trail classes

The trail class will be made up of obstacles and movements that would be encountered on the trail. In-hand competitors will follow the intermediate trail course; horse may be saddled and in full tack or just in a halter. Beginners are only expected to walk, Intermediate level riders are expected to walk and trot, Advanced level riders are expected to walk, trot and canter. Beginners may be led on a line. USEF Trail scoring will be used.

FUN CLASSES

Class #14 – Costume Leadline

All costumes must be Christmas/Holiday themed and on horseback. Riders must be led by a walker. Best costume wins!

Class #15 – Musical Horses

Pairs of riders will be used in this challenge. Each pair will present one horse. One member will ride and the other will stand by a cone. When the music plays, riders will ride around the outside of the ring. When the music stops, riders must return to their team member's cone, halt and dismount and the rider at the cone must mount. The last person to mount eliminates their team and their cone will be removed. Last team standing wins.

HUNTER/JUMPER SECTIONS

Class #19 – Hunter Pace

A hunter pace is a low-key competitive event derived from foxhunting. Teams of two or three riders follow an outdoor course laid out over terrain which is meant to simulate the riding conditions encountered during a foxhunt - that is, a mixture of gaits that a foxhunter typically uses as a fox's scent is found and followed by hounds through open country and along wooded trails. It is up to each team to guess what the organizers of the pace have decided is an ideal time to complete the course and to adjust its progress accordingly. The ideal time is determined by sending out one or more test teams to ride the course before the event. On the day of the event, the team which completes the course in a time closest to the ideal is placed first. Name your team member(s) on the entry form. If you do not have a team member, you will be assigned one once all entries are received.

Hunter Derbies (Classes 33 & 44)

The courses for the Hunter Derby are designed to more closely resemble the hunt field, with fewer groundlines, taller, narrower fences, ditches, gates, banks, walls, hedges, and more. The approaches to jumps vary greatly, from short to long to serpentine, and are completely negotiable. Riders are rewarded for choosing more difficult routes, which can even include optional jumps. They differ from current hunter classes primarily in the construction of the fences and the track between them. The United States Hunter Jumper Association says, "The courses will be built to encourage and reward brilliance and daring from the rider and true athletic ability from the horses."

Each Hunter Derby consists of two rounds: the Hunter Classic Course (Hunter 2 round from your level will count as the classic round) and the Handy Hunter Course.

In case of a tie, horses will be asked to compete in a shortened version of the course for a jump-off.

Jumper Derbies (Class 51)

The jumper derby consists of 2 rounds in which all faults will accumulate. If there is a tie for first place, those riders will return for an exciting jump-off, with the winner being the horse and rider with the fastest, cleanest time.

Other Events

White elephant gift exchange

In the white elephant gift exchange, each participant supplies one wrapped gift. The gifts are placed in a central location, and participants determine in what order they will take turns selecting them. The first person opens a wrapped gift and the turn ends. On subsequent turns, each person can open a new present or gets the choice to "steal" another person's unwrapped gift (Gift steals are capped at 3 steals). When a person's gift is stolen, that person chooses another wrapped gift to open. The game is over when the last person has taken their turn.
